



Secondly, the special characteristics of Southwest Germany, namely the dedication with which over 200 home, farm and large breweries work to expand the nuances of the beer spectrum. By the way, the tasting goes even more smoothly if you first hike to quench your thirst on the hop trails. You can also learn the flowery craft yourself, for example on guided tours or in special brewing courses. Insiders confirmed: The deeper you dive, the better it tastes.

CLASSIC MAULTASCHEN



Ingredients

- 400 g flour
- 4 eggs with
- A bit of water
- Salt
- 150 g minced meat (half and half)
- 300 g veal roast
- 200 g blanched spinach chopped
- · 1 small onion, diced
- 2 eggs
- nutmeg
- · Salt and pepper
- Meat broth
- Chives
- Stale bread cut into cubes

1. Dough

Knead a smooth dough from flour, eggs, salt and a little water. Roll it out with a rolling pin into a thin rectangular sheet of dough.

2. Filling

For the filling, soak the bread cubes in a little hot water and then express it well.

Mix all the listed ingredients well in a large bowl and season to taste.

3. Preparation

Spread the filling about 0.5 centimeter thick over the pasta dough except for two centimeters at the top edge and roll it up twice. Brush the overlapping edge of the dough with egg yolk, fold it over and press it firmly. Cut off the Maultaschen with a knife (approx. 100 g per Maultasche). Simmer gently in the meat broth for about twelve minutes.

Ultimately, grapes grow in regions that have suitable and preferred climates. Plump grapes grow only on vines that face the sun. Particularly important In both wine regions: Württemberg and Baden, the people know how to evaluate their product. In the end, the wine tastes best in social gatherings with excellent meals. When it comes to hospitality, winemakers are among the top addresses. The little drops that they pour make a pleasant stay evolve into a true holiday as a wine experience in Southwest Germany becomes an experience of complete wellbeing.







Baden. Sunny Excellence.

In the most southern wine growing area of Germany, the wine hills have the most sun exposure, especially in Kaiserstuhl and Markgräflerland. Baden is the only German wine-growing region in the sun-drenched EU wine-growing zone B. The third largest wine growing region stretches over 400 km (249 mi) from Tauberfranken to Lake Constance. Prestigious wines such as the well-known Burgundy but also the Gutedel and Müller-Thurgau. Leading wine specialists gush over the fact that when it comes to excellence, Baden wines are just as good as the neighboring French wines.

Steep positions, steep career. The terraced vineyards are picturesquely piled up along the Neckar and its tributaries. It feels like the view goes vertically upwards. This also applies to the quality of the wines. The preferred grape varieties are Trollinger, Lemberger, Schwarzriesling, Pinot Noir and Riesling. Progressive cooperatives have drawn on this wealth and transformed the classic red wine country into a wine industry hotspot. There is also a new independent young wine-growing generation, which is making a name for itself with surprising wines.

These temporary businesses are only in full swing for a few weeks a year. In Southwest Germany, you know where and which place is currently open.

The "Weinsüden" pop-ups are one of the highlights of the year. They are organized by several young winemakers directly in the vineyards. Young, relaxed, unconventional. People taste and compare, celebrate and chat. The main thing is that everyone is together and it is even better when guests come along. The best time is between May and September on sunny days with the happy prospect of an extension into the late evening.

Small tip: before you leave the café, don't forget to take the items that you bought in the charming shop across the way.

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




